

Structure

The commission is composed of twelve (12) members, five (5) of which are Bedford business owners, one (1) of which is an HEB Chamber of Commerce member and six (6) of which are Bedford residents. One ex officio member shall be a member of the City Council and shall serve as a liaison between the Commission and the City Council. All members must either operate a business within the city limits or be a Bedford residents for twelve (12) consecutive months preceding the appointment. The members of the Community Affairs Commission shall serve for a two-year period. Meetings are held quarterly or as necessary.

Powers and Duties

The Bedford Community Affairs Commission focuses on various aspects of business and residential concerns.

The Commission shall:

- Serve in an advisory capacity and shall provide the City Council with feedback on business and residential concerns.
- Provide specific input on any items that make doing business with the city of Bedford difficult and point out areas of concern.
- Explore issues of public interest as identified and designated by the City Council, collect information on these issues and make constructive recommendations to Council and staff if any action should be taken by the city to satisfy those issues.
